NZ 2011 FESTIVAL LOTTERY FUND

A new Lottery fund was announced by Prime Minister John Key, Internal Affairs Minister Nathan Guy, Rugby World Cup Minister Murray McCully, and Economic Development Minister Gerry Brownlee at a press conference at Tourism New Zealand.

The New Zealand Lottery Grants Board has allocated \$9.48 million for the [NZ 2011 Festival Lottery Fund Committee](#), which has been established to support public events and activities associated with the Rugby World Cup 2011 that celebrate New Zealand's culture, heritage and diversity.

"Rugby World Cup 2011 will be the largest sporting event ever held in New Zealand, and we want to maximise community involvement," Mr Guy said.

"With 23 centres hosting either games or teams, the celebrations and economic benefits are already going to be spread around. This funding will help regions and communities play a major part in the festivities around Rugby World Cup 2011."

The fund will be administered by the [Local Government and Community Branch](#) and decisions will be made by members of the 2011 Group - Bob Parker, Sir David Gascoigne, Bob Harvey, Sharon Hunter, and Wally Stone.

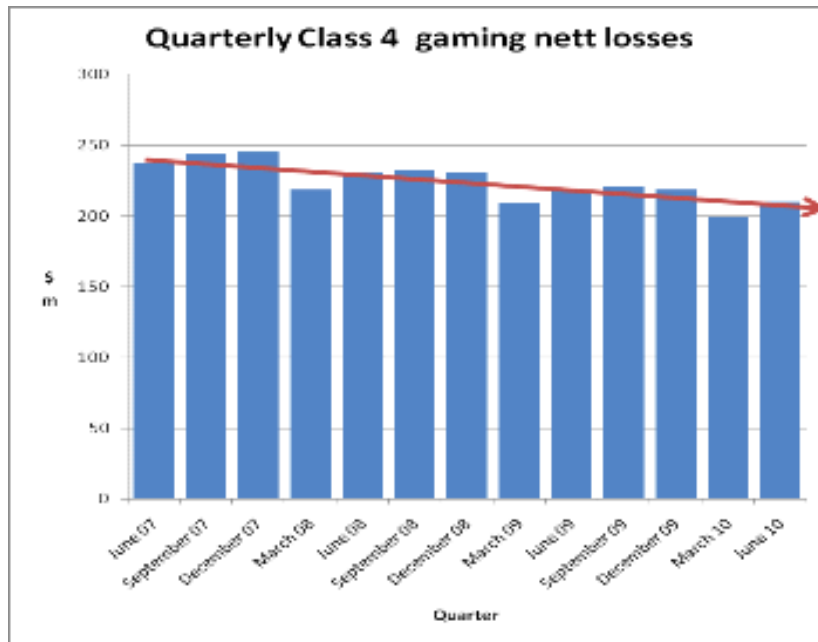

GAMING REVENUE

Gaming revenue continues downward trend.

Recently released Internal Affairs statistics to 30 June confirm the continued downward trend of gaming turnover. Key points over the past twelve months include:

- Expenditure (net losses) fell 4.5 per cent from \$889 million at 30 June 2009 to \$849.2 million at 30 June 2010
- License holders dropped 4 per cent from 384 to 370
- Venues dropped 3 per cent from 1501 to 1455
- Gaming machines numbers were also 3 per cent down from 19,479 to 18,944.



The pattern over the past three years is consistent. In general this means there is less money available for distribution to the community.

A minimum of 37.12% of net losses must be redistributed as grants. In terms of funds to sport other factors will also have an influence, such as:

- Changes in the use of gaming funds in the racing industry
- The Lion Foundation/Perry merger, the net effect of which is still somewhat unknown
- Movements of machines between trusts that have different granting emphasis
- The ongoing impact of the end user trusts

Many organisations are now reducing dependency on gaming, particularly in the areas of core business. It is reasonable to assume that this downward trend will continue. The larger trusts are also considering a more strategic application of their funds rather than propping up business as usual. As the era of easily available gaming funds continues to fade, organisations are now examining business models that have core business matched by sustainable revenue. Gaming funds will remain a significant part of the landscape but will be best used for projects that drive change, deliver demonstrable benefit and leave an organisation stronger when the investment ends.

“Creating partnerships between schools and clubs helps to create continuity between school sports and sport in the wider community”

Did you know?

- Most communities do not know what clubs are in their area - personal contact is the best way to promote your club
- Youngsters are more likely to get involved if they know what they're dealing with- if they have already seen club coaches in the familiar surroundings of their school they are more likely to attend the club! (As they already know the coach!)
- Schools and clubs can work together to promote local sporting opportunities much more effectively.

Have you thought about how your club

- Provide the school with information and promotional material about the club
- Tell the schools about their pupil's achievements
- Provide officials for some school fixtures /tournaments

- Sit on School sports committees

How a school club partnership can work

Takapuna Grammar and the Navy Netball club link up

- In netball, the school committee has linked in with the Navy Netball Club. Now a representative from the Navy club sits in on the school netball committee meetings.
- The biggest incentive for the club to form links with the school was the opportunity to access to the school leavers and promote their club as a place to play when they have left school.
- In return for access to the school leavers the Navy Netball club helps the school by providing facilities, coaches, referees, etc. The Club helped Takapuna Grammar with their netball trials by providing a venue and people to help select the teams.
